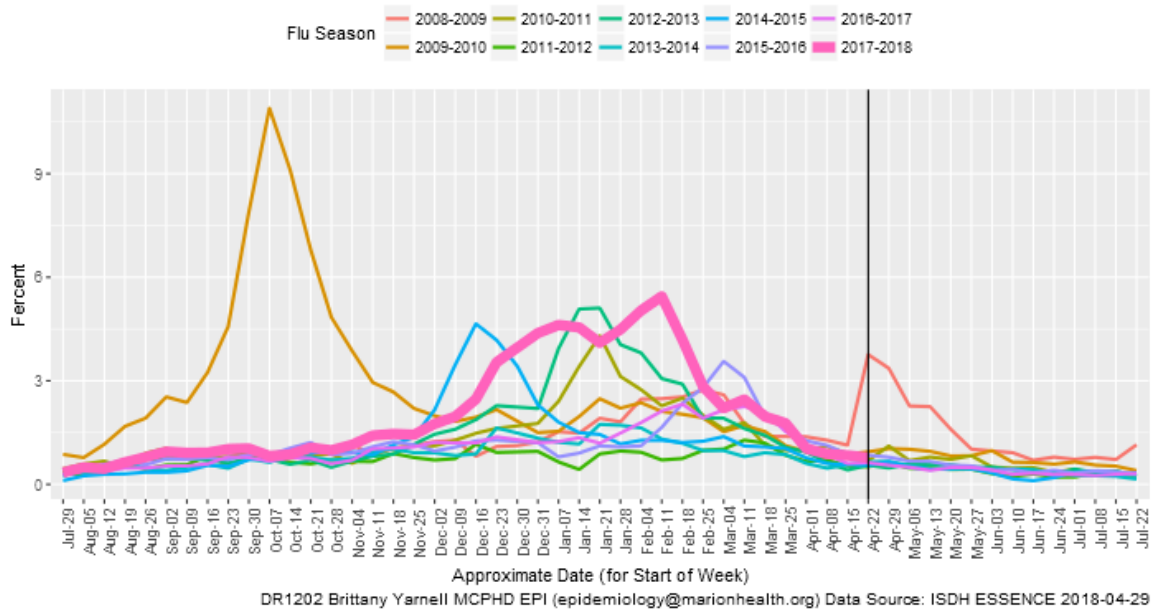
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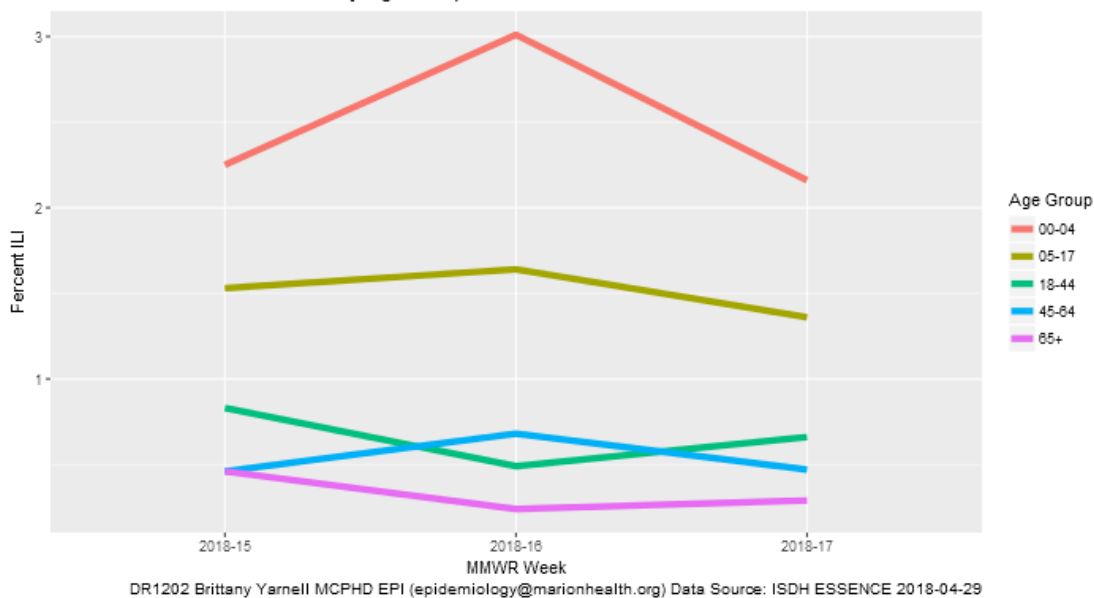
Updates on Most Recent Local Activity: Week 17 (Apr 22 – Apr 28)

- Visits with Influenza-like Illness (ILI) symptoms continue to decline in Marion County Emergency Departments, and they made up only 0.78% of visits for Week 17. This percent is similar to what we see when we are not in the influenza season.
- There have been 24 influenza-associated deaths for Marion County residents this flu season.
- In Marion County hospitals' ED population, ILI was most common in the 0-4 age group. Among ED visits by 0-4 year olds, 2.16% were for ILI. ILI among ED visits by 5-17 year olds was next highest, at 1.36%.

Note: ILI (Influenza-Like Illness) visit means that the patient reported fever with cough or sore throat, or used the word "flu" or "influenza" to describe either their symptoms or their reason for the ED (Emergency Department) visit.

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Local (Week 16)

- The percentage of ILI related ED visits was 0.84%.
- Children age 0-4 had the highest age-specific percent ILI (3.01%).

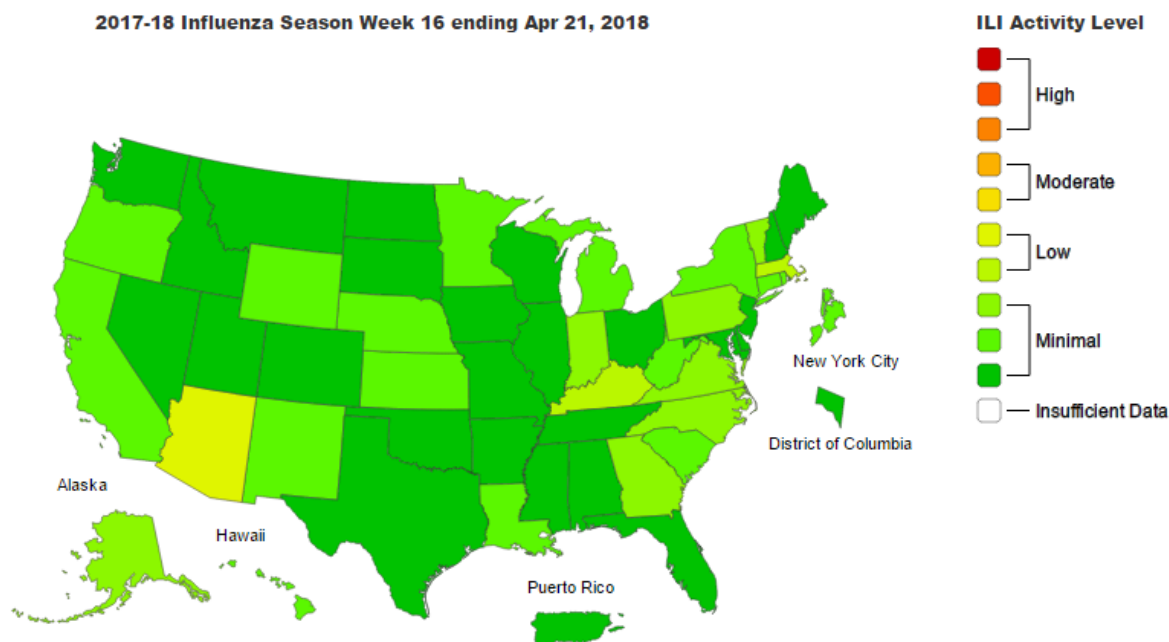
Indiana (Week 16)

- Indiana is experiencing sporadic and minimal ILI activity. For Week 16, ISDH reports 2.09% ILI at sentinel provider sites and 1.18% ILI ED visits. This is a decrease for sentinel sites and EDs.
- The total number of mortalities in Indiana this flu season is 324.
- Week 16 results for samples tested at the state lab: 2 specimens tested positive for Influenza A/H3 seasonal virus, 1 tested positive for Influenza A/H1N1pdm virus, and 7 specimens tested positive for Influenza B seasonal virus (Yamagata or Victoria).

National (Week 16)

- During Week 16, influenza activity decreased in the United States, and the majority states were reporting minimal and local influenza activity. In addition, during Week 16, 1.7% of outpatient visits reported through the U.S. Outpatient Influenza-like Illness Surveillance Network (ILINet) were due to ILI. This was lower than Week 15 (1.8%).
- 160 influenza-associated pediatric deaths have been reported to CDC this flu season.
- The percent of respiratory specimens testing positive for influenza in clinical laboratories decreased. During Week 16, the numbers of positive specimens for influenza A (30.6%) was lower than influenza B (69.4%).

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
