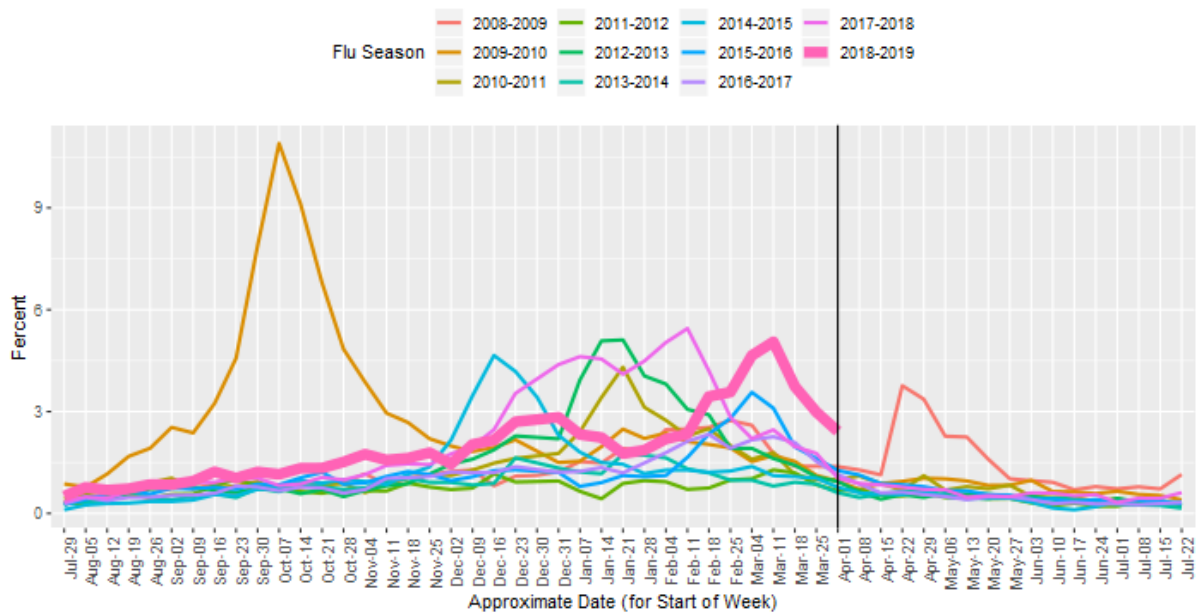
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Updates on Most Recent Local Activity: Week 14 (March 31 – April 06)

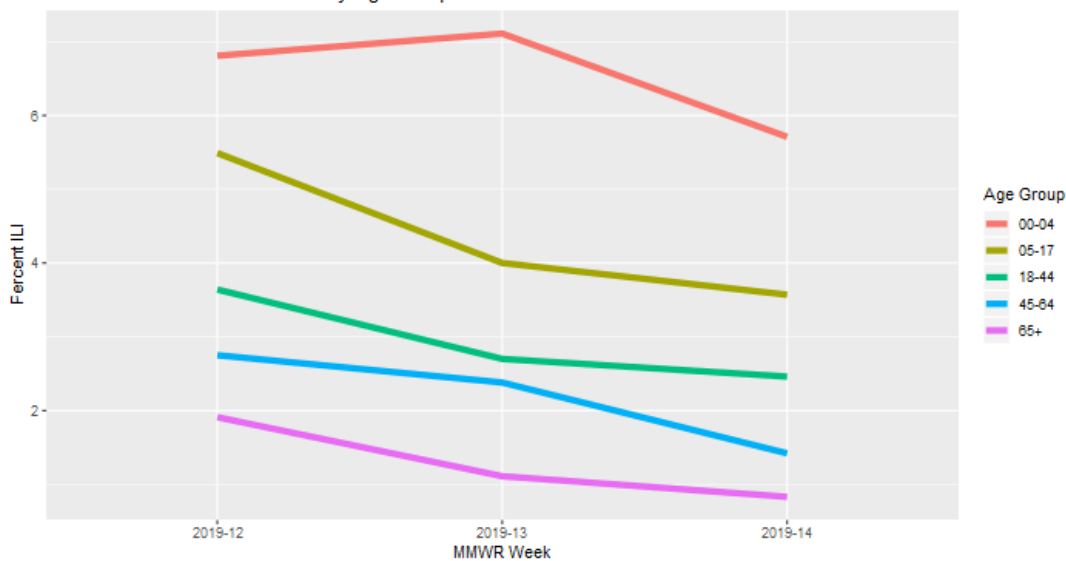
- During Week 14, ILI symptoms made up 2.41% of Marion County ED visits, which is above the 2.0% baseline for flu season.
- There have been sixteen influenza-associated deaths for Marion County residents this flu season.
- In Marion County hospitals' ED population, ILI was most common in the 0-4 age group. Among ED visits by 0-4 year olds 5.71% was for ILI. ILI among ED visits by 5-17 year olds was next highest, at 3.57%.

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Note: ILI (Influenza-Like Illness) visit means that the patient reported fever with cough or sore throat, or used the word "flu" or "influenza" to describe either their symptoms or their reason for the ED (Emergency Department) visit.

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Local (Week 13)

- The percentage of ILI related ED visits was 2.99%.
- Children between 0 to 4 years old had the highest age-specific percent ILI (7.11%).

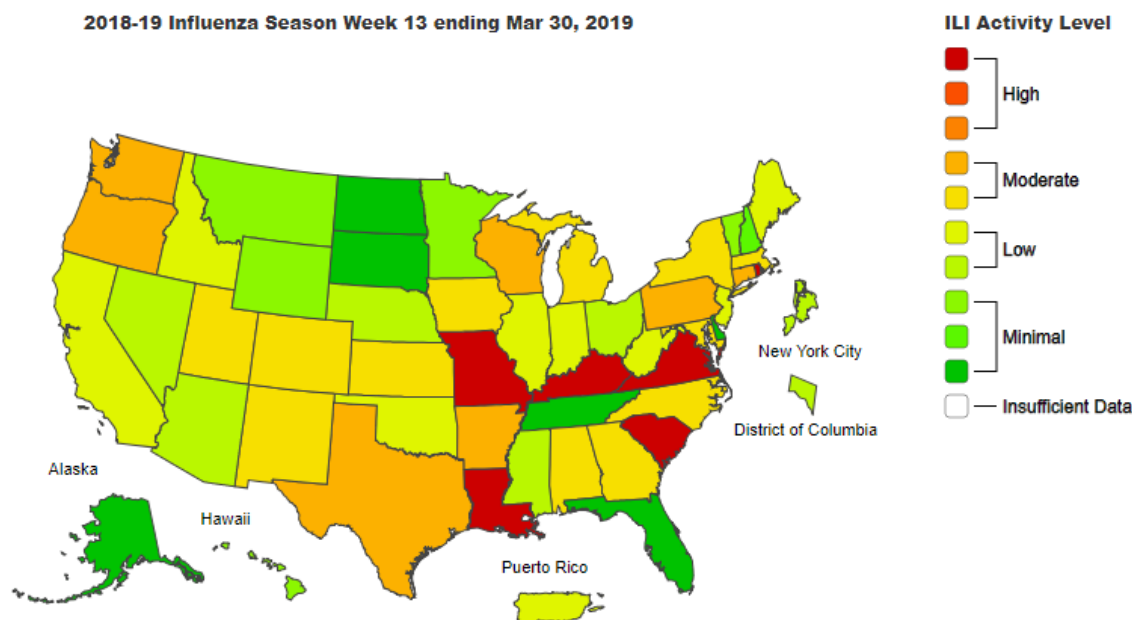
Indiana (Week 13)

- Indiana is experiencing widespread and high ILI activity. For Week 13, ISDH reports 2.87% ILI at sentinel provider sites and 3.14% ILI ED visits. This is a decrease for sentinel providers (3.86% Week 12) and ED visits (3.92% Week 12).
- There have been eighty-two influenza-associated deaths in Indiana for the 2018/2019 flu season.
- Week 13 results for samples tested at the state lab: 14 specimen tested positive for 2009 A/H1N1pdm and 27 specimen tested positive for Influenza A/H3 seasonal virus.

National (Week 13)

- During Week 13, influenza activity decreased but remains elevated in the United States. The majority states were reporting low to moderate and widespread influenza activity, and during Week 13, 3.2% of outpatient visits reported through the U.S. Outpatient Influenza-like Illness Surveillance Network (ILINet) were due to ILI. This is lower than Week 12 (3.8%).
- Eighty-two influenza-associated pediatric deaths have been reported to CDC for the 2018/2019 flu season.
- The percent of respiratory specimens testing positive for influenza in clinical laboratories decreased. During Week 13, the numbers of positive specimens for influenza A (92.8%) was higher than influenza B (7.2%).

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
