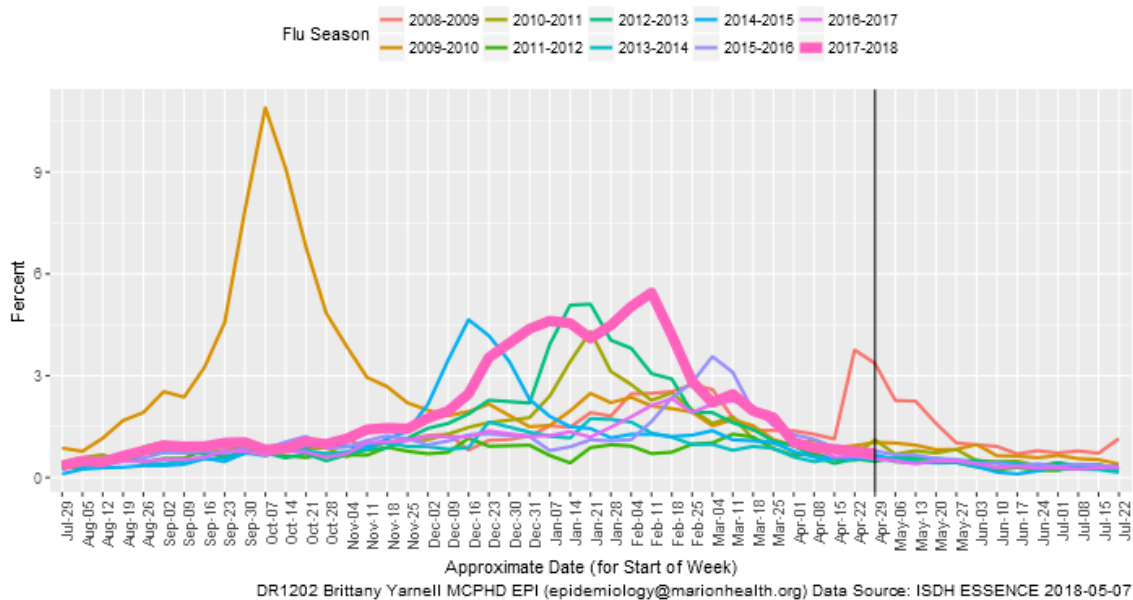
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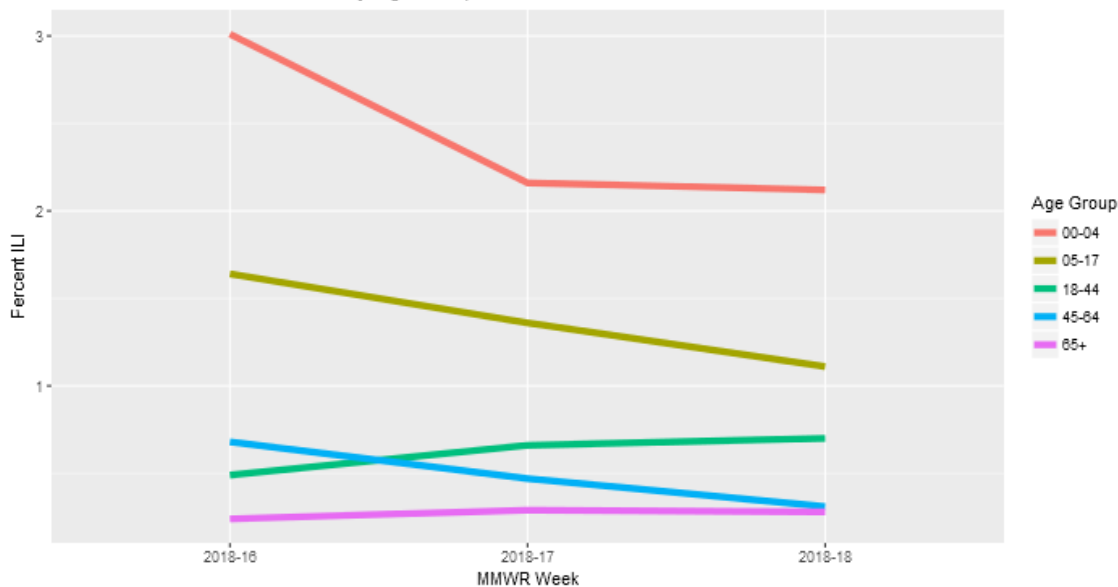
Updates on Most Recent Local Activity: Week 18 (Apr 29 – May 05)

- Visits with Influenza-like Illness (ILI) symptoms continue to decline in Marion County Emergency Departments, and they made up only 0.72% of visits for Week 18. This percent is similar to what we see when we are not in the influenza season.
- There have been 25 influenza-associated deaths for Marion County residents this flu season.
- In Marion County hospitals' ED population, ILI was most common in the 0-4 age group. Among ED visits by 0-4 year olds, 2.12% were for ILI. ILI among ED visits by 5-17 year olds was next highest, at 1.11%.

Note: ILI (Influenza-Like Illness) visit means that the patient reported fever with cough or sore throat, or used the word "flu" or "influenza" to describe either their symptoms or their reason for the ED (Emergency Department) visit.

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Local (Week 17)

- The percentage of ILI related ED visits was 0.78%.
- Children age 0-4 had the highest age-specific percent ILI (2.16%).

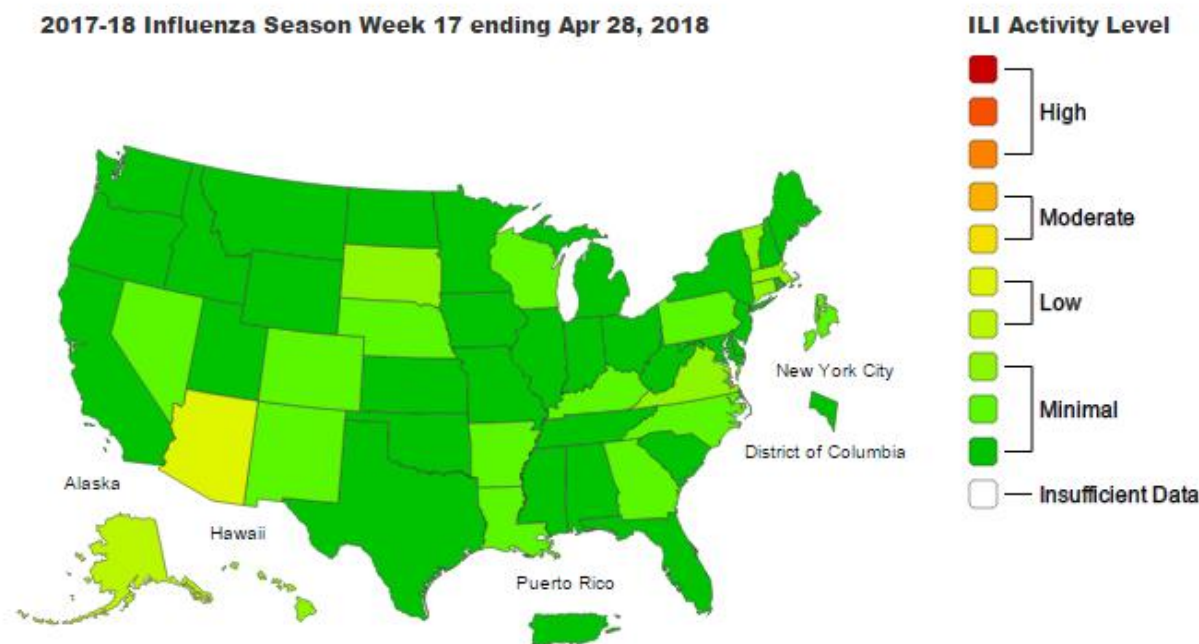
Indiana (Week 17)

- Indiana is experiencing sporadic and minimal ILI activity. For Week 17, ISDH reports 1.41% ILI at sentinel provider sites and 1.16% ILI ED visits. This is a decrease for sentinel sites and EDs.
- The total number of mortalities in Indiana this flu season is 327.
- Week 17 results for samples tested at the state lab: 1 specimens tested positive for Influenza B seasonal virus (Yamagata or Victoria).

National (Week 17)

- During Week 17, influenza activity decreased in the United States, and the majority states were reporting minimal and local influenza activity. In addition, during Week 17, 1.5% of outpatient visits reported through the U.S. Outpatient Influenza-like Illness Surveillance Network (ILINet) were due to ILI. This was lower than Week 16 (1.7%).
- 163 influenza-associated pediatric deaths have been reported to CDC this flu season.
- The percent of respiratory specimens testing positive for influenza in clinical laboratories decreased. During Week 17, the numbers of positive specimens for influenza A (33.6%) was lower than influenza B (66.4%).

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
